KEY STATISTICS

13.4 % of Australians are living below the poverty line, equating to around 3.2 million Australians.

1 in 8 Australian adults and 1 in 6 Australian children do not have access to adequate essential clothing, which we believe is a basic human right.

A wardrobe of clothing consists of around 20-35 items, depending on the circumstances of the individual.



It costs \$5 to provide a complete wardrobe of clothing & accessories to one person



We are supporting around 2,500 individuals with clothing every week

We partner with 1,000+ Charities and Social Service agencies nationwide

We also rely on corporate teams and groups of volunteers who help at our warehouse to enable us to distribute clothing as quickly as possible.
